① Those who do not need detailed examination

Neck examination: We were unable to make a judgment in this examination. Please receive re-examination at a medical institution you received the examination.

★ How to receive a detailed inspection

- If you had an individual checkup, please consult with the medical institution where you received the primary checkup, and then submit the "Chiba City Uterine Cancer Detailed Examination Request Form" and "Uterine Cancer questionnaire" and your health insurance card.
- If you had a group checkup, please take the "Chiba City Uterine Cancer Detailed Examination" issued by Chiba City, your results report form and your health insurance card.

* As a reference for where to consult, please refer to the back of the separate sheet "Information on Detailed Examinations" for medical institutions cooperating with detailed examinations for cervical cancer.

Cervical cancer screening does not detect 100% of cervical cancers. If you have subjective symptoms, please consult a medical institution immediately.

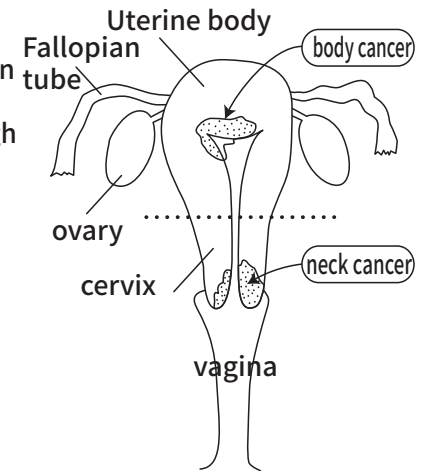
★ There are two types of cervical cancer: cervical cancer and body cancer

① Cervical cancer

"Cancer at the entrance of the uterus (the part near the vagina), It ranks first among women in their 20s for cancer rates. It is Also known as the mother killer. It begins to increase in the late 30s, and in the late 30s to 40s occur frequently.

Most of the causes are humans infected through sexual intercourse. Papillomaviruses are involved and phases of sexual intercourse The more you have, the greater the risk of infection and the risk of uterine cancer.

Smoking is also a risk factor for uterine cancer. Since there are no subjective symptoms in the early stages, it is important to detect it early through regular checkups.



② Uterine body cancer

It is a cancer that develops in the corpus of the uterus, deep inside the uterus. It increases from the late 40s, peaks in the 50s and 60s, and then decreases. Early detection is important because treatment results are better in the early stages. If you notice even a small amount of unrelated bleeding or a chocolate-colored discharge, see your gynecologist immediately.

Health consultation

The Health Division of each ward's Health and Welfare Center provides health consultations such as prevention of lifestyle-related diseases, as well as smoking cessation support (individual consultations for those who wish to quit smoking). In addition, please note that the Health Division may inform you about health-related lectures, etc.
